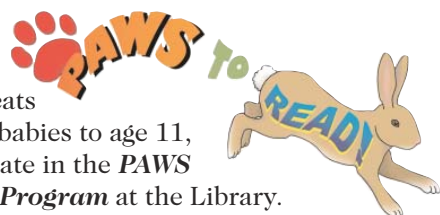


Summer Reading Programs at the Library

Kingfish: The Reign of Huey P. Long

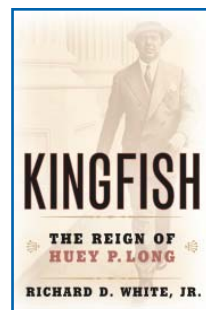
With Author Dr. Richard White

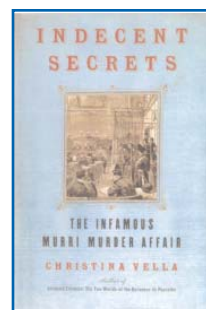
Indecent Secrets
