

## 29<sup>th</sup> Annual AUTHOR/ILLUSTRATOR PROGRAM

**E**eeek! Ghosts, haunted houses and dancing skeletons? With Halloween just around the corner, this author puts the fun back into fright!

The East Baton Rouge Parish Library will celebrate its twenty-ninth annual **Author/Illustrator Program** on Thursday, October 26, and Friday, October 27. This year's special guest is Cynthia DeFelice, a well-known, award-winning author of novels for young adults and picture books for children. Her stories range from spooky mysteries such as *The Ghost Fossil Glen*, to dramatic fiction including *The Apprenticeship of Lucas Whitaker*, which was named an American Library Association Notable Book and a *School Library Journal* Best Book of the Year. DeFelice has also authored many picture books with a humorous twist while recapturing classic folktales, such as *Mule Eggs* and *The Dancing Skeleton*.

Everyone is invited to attend the Thursday program at 7:00 p.m. at the Bluebonnet Regional Branch Library, where DeFelice will discuss "STORIES to Touch the Heart and Tickle the Funny Bone." A reception, book sale, and autograph session will follow. Admission is free.

DeFelice will conduct a workshop for teachers, librarians, writers and

parents on Friday at the Bluebonnet Regional Branch Library from 8:00 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. Registration fee for the workshop is \$25.00 per person and \$10.00 for college students with school identification. A book sale and autograph session will follow.

DeFelice attended Syracuse University in New York and received a Master's degree in Library Science. After college, while working as an elementary school librarian, DeFelice saw something magical about a child's facial expressions when he/she was enthralled by a wonderful book or story.

"I loved reading aloud to children, telling them stories, recommending books for them, and hearing their responses when they brought the books back," says DeFelice.

"When I was a child, I never would have guessed that I would become a writer. But I did love to read, and I loved when

my mother read to me, my brothers and sister," says DeFelice. "She read to us every night, acting out the voices

of the characters in books with great enthusiasm. She passed along her love of language, and I'm sure it's because of her that I eventually became a children's author."

By turning a glimmer of an idea, a ghost of a character, or a piece of fascinating history into a fully detailed story, DeFelice feels incredibly lucky to be an author and storyteller.

"I love creating a character out of thin air, and feeling that character come to life beneath my fingers on the computer keyboard. I like working at two o'clock in the morning if I want to, and wearing pajamas or sweatpants to work. I like being my own boss," says DeFelice. "I love writing a book that I would have loved to read when I was a child. I love hearing from children that something I wrote touched them in some way, making them laugh or cry, or think and feel something special."

Since its creation in 1978, the **Author/Illustrator Program** has been a great success and affords teachers, librarians, parents, and other interested adults an excellent opportunity for an exchange of ideas with prominent writers, artists, scholars, and performers of literature for children and young adults.

"I have thoroughly enjoyed listening to the speakers we have had

## Library Places Information Kiosk at CATS Bus Station

Public Information Kiosk, or PIKinc., a division of 3M Library Systems, has donated an information kiosk to the East Baton Rouge Parish Library. The kiosk, or E-Branch Library, has been installed at the CATS bus station. The East Baton Rouge Parish Library was chosen to receive the kiosk in acknowledgement of the tremendous increase in library service in the aftermath of Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. "The Library recognizes that many displaced residents rely upon public transportation," says Library Director Lydia M. Acosta, "Locating the kiosk at the CATS terminal guarantees access to those who need the resources of the kiosk and the Library as well as the Capital Area Transit System." Around 5.5 million people come through the location annually, making it an ideal place for information access.

Positioned in the bus terminal next to the Customer Service desk, the E-Branch will serve as an information resource for those in emergency situations or in need of assistance. The kiosk has a touch and find screen, with links to several state resources, such as Housing Assistance and Hurricane Disaster Relief. The kiosk phone connects patrons to the Library Information Service hotline. Internet access is also available; however, websites are limited.

"The kiosk represents an incredible partnership between CATS and the East Baton Rouge Parish Library system. Mrs. Acosta's vision has blessed our customers with an invaluable resource. We look forward to more partnering opportunities in the future," says Dwight Brashear, Chief Executive Officer for the Capital Area Transit System, (CATS).

PIKinc. has distributed 25 E-Branch Libraries to different parts of Louisiana, Texas, Mississippi, and Alabama, as a result of the devastation caused by Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. "We are proud and pleased that we can be a part of recovery efforts for those who need access to information and the Internet," said Fred E. Goodman, president of PIKinc. In other states, kiosks have been placed in Wal-Mart, food centers, bus stations, and senior citizen centers.

The E-Branch is available during the same hours of operation for the CATS terminal – Monday through Friday, 5:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., and Saturdays from 6:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

Dr. Charles Elliott, professor in the Department of History and Political Science at Southeastern Louisiana University, will introduce and lead discussions on the book *Isaac’s Storm: A Man, A Time, and the Deadliest Hurricane in History* by Erik Larson and a wide variety of issues arising from the experiences of Louisiana’s people in Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Rita, and past hurricanes such as Audrey, Lily, Andrew, Camille, and others.

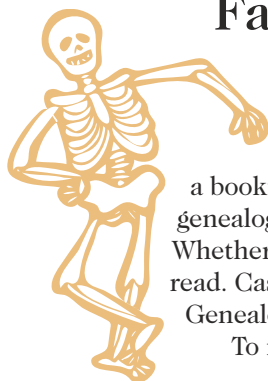

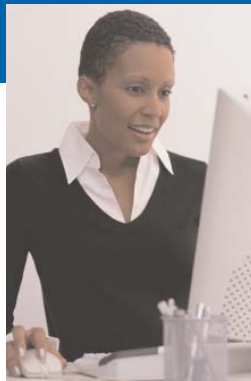
