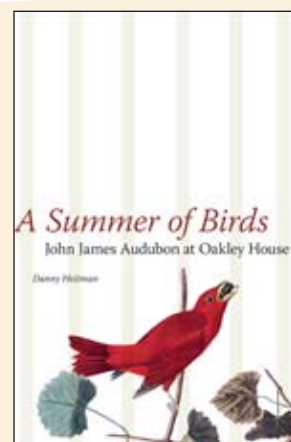
Trask was born in Brockton, Massachusetts. After receiving

### Danny Heitman Visits Library

Journalist and essayist, Danny Heitman, will be at the Main Library, on Saturday, June 21, at 2:00 p.m. to discuss his work, *A Summer of Birds*. In his new book, Heitman discusses the events that occurred during John James Audubon's summer with the Pirrie family at the Oakley Plantation in 1821. Nestled in the woods outside St. Francisville, Oakley House provided a wonderland for the world's most famous bird artist. "The unique geography of the region attracted a particularly rich range of species, and it was essentially a living library of subjects for him," says Heitman. "Oakley renewed Audubon's sense of possibility and inspired a period of intense creativity." Included in the book are photographs of Oakley House and the Pirrie family, as well as Audubon's paintings from his Oakley period.



Heitman is an award-winning columnist for *The Advocate* and a member of *The Advocate's* editorial board. He has contributed essays to the *Smithsonian*, *Christian Science Monitor*, and other national publications and recently won the "In Character" prize for editorial and opinion writing.

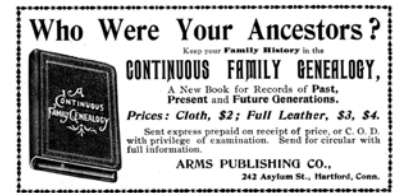

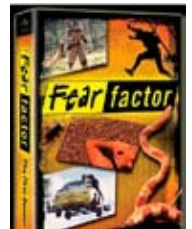
